A special thank you to all our volunteers and staff members who have worked tirelessly to make this event possible. Your dedication has made this occasion a reality, and we appreciate your time and talents.



Our Adjudicators




Ron Coberley is a graduate of Drake University. He taught instrumental music in the New London, Ia. Comm. School district for 40 years, retiring in 2006. Since that time, he has been active in substitute teaching in band and has been a guest clinician in numerous area schools in marching, concert, and jazz bands. He served as an IHSMA approved adjudicator for 55 years. Tonight marks the 19th time he has been a judge for the Mt. Pleasant Marching Invitational.

Dave Newport retired in the spring of 2010 after 33 years of teaching in the state of Iowa. He was director of bands at Grinnell High School for 20 years and also taught at LaPorte City (Union High School), Montezuma and Winfield/Mt. Union. Dave received his BA and MA in music education from the University of Northern Iowa.

A member of Iowa Bandmasters Association, Newport has served as district president of both Southeast and Northeast Iowa Bandmasters Associations. In 1999, Dave received the Outstanding Iowa Teacher Award from Grinnell College and was the recipient of the Grinnell Educator and Citizen of the Year award in 2006. Newport served as an advisor and administrator with Iowa Ambassadors of Music from 1988-2008 and was the city coordinator in Rothenburg, Germany for Ambassadors of Music in 2013 and 2014 and Salzburg, Austria in 2023.

Dave continues to be active in music education throughout Iowa as an adjudicator, clinician, and honor band conductor. He and his wife, Connie, live in Menomonie, Wisconsin.





Patrick Kearney currently serves as the 8th grade band director in the Johnston Community Schools. Prior to that, he spent 15 years as the high school Director of Bands and 5 years as the district's Facilitator for Teacher Leadership. Mr. Kearney has served as the President of the Iowa Bandmasters Association, Co-Chair of the Iowa Jazz Championships, and Executive Director of the Adventureland Festival of Bands. Bands under his direction have performed at the Iowa Bandmasters Association annual conference and the Jazz Educators Network inaugural conference. He is the 2023 recipient of the Karl King Award from the Iowa Bandmasters Association. Mr. Kearney is an active writer on education issues, with his writing appearing in the Washington Post, the New York Times, and the Des Moines Register, among other publications. His wife, Cathy, is a band director in the Des Moines Public Schools, and his son, Brogan, is a band director at Ankeny Centennial High School.

Doug Krejci has been a percussion musician, educator, and judge for over 35 years. Mr. Krejci has performed with Orchestra Iowa, Ed Shaughnessy, Eastern Iowa Brass Band, Buena Vista University, Cornell College, Kirkwood College, Cedar Rapids Municipal Band, Clear Lake Municipal Band, the Storm Lake Municipal Band, the Iowa City Community Band, the Eastern Iowa Brass Band, Orchestra Iowa, and the Karl King Band among many other groups as a performing, ensemble, and solo percussionist. He currently instructs and arranges percussion for multiple high school drumlines and percussion sections of various sizes independently and through the Iowa Alliance for Arts Education. Mr. Krejci is an in-demand clinician for both marching and orchestral percussion. Mr. Krejci was recently recognized by the Wisconsin School Music Association as a Master Adjudicator, that organizations' highest-rated adjudicator level. Mr. Krejci lives in Cedar Rapids, Iowa with his wife and 18-year-old daughter, who is also a percussionist.







The opportunity to return to his hometown of Fairfield, Iowa to become the director of bands at Fairfield High School brought him back, where he spent 29 years teaching there. He retired from teaching in 2021. Jim is also involved in many other musical activities. He has directed the Fairfield Municipal Band for the past 30 years, directs the Fairfield Jazz Band, is musical director for the Fairfield Area Community Theater, and has directed the orchestra for the Van Buren Players for the past 12 years. He also directs a church choir and bell choir. He is an active member of the Iowa Bandmasters Association and has acted as an IBA mentor to new directors for the past 2 years. He also continues to serve as a judge and clinician for marching and solo and ensemble events. Past honors include the Southeast Iowa Bandmasters Association's Karl King Distinguished Service Award, State Of Iowa Governor's Volunteer Award, Fairfield Schools' Teacher Of The Year, a National Board Certified Teacher, and Fairfield's







The Spirit of Northwest Marching Band is in its 54nd year of competition in the Marching Arts. The marching band continues its storied history of consistent top 3 finishes at marching band festivals in the Greater St. Louis region along with festivals in Missouri, Illinois, Kentucky, Tennessee, Arkansas, Iowa and Kansas. The Spirit of Northwest competes and performs annually at the St. Louis Thanksgiving Day Parade, the 8th largest Thanksgiving Parade in the United States, and at the St. Louis 4th of July Parade, the 3rd largest 4th of July Parade in the United States, where they are a consistent top 3 finisher. The band is also a 4 time participant in the Bands of America St. Louis Super Regional. Previous trips for Northwest include the 2019 AutoZone Liberty Bowl, where they won the Grand Championship, a 2022 appearance at the Chicago Thanksgiving Day Parade, and the 2024 Class A Championship at the All State Sugar Bowl in New Orleans along with a 2nd place parade finish. In addition to the award-winning marching band, Northwest's High School Band Program includes a 90-student Concert Band, 2 pep bands, a competitive Jazz Ensemble, and a competitive Winter Guard in the Mid Continent Color Guard Association. Their Jazz Ensemble competes at top Jazz Festivals in the Greater St. Louis Region.


